We're excited to see all attendees in person this year!

Yes, for the first time since 2019, all attendees will be in person at the **Hyatt Embarcadero in San Francisco**; there will be no virtual option. We're excited to bring everyone together to participate in the hands-on and networking components of the conference, and we are confident the in-person experience will enhance the value of your participation.

This course, chaired by **Dr. Robert Wachter**, covers the clinical issues most relevant to hospitalists and other clinicians who care for inpatients. Taught by UCSF's top teachers, the course – now in its 29th year – highlights recent advances and current controversies. To promote active learning, the course uses an audience response system and features multiple workshops in a variety of disciplines to allow for small group discussions. It includes broad content in critical care, perioperative care, radiology, neurology, cardiology, GI, diabetes, rheumatology, nephrology, and infectious diseases. In addition, there are sessions on substance use, delirium, AI, and diagnostic reasoning.

This course is presented by the UCSF Division of Hospital Medicine and is sponsored by the Office of Continuing Medical Education, University of California, San Francisco School of Medicine. It also serves as the West Coast regional meeting of the Society of Hospital Medicine.

OBJECTIVES

An attendee completing the **Management of the Hospitalized Patient** course should be able to:

- Improve diagnosis of common inpatient clinical presentations;
- Perform an evidence-based work-up for common inpatient clinical presentations;
- Apply modern therapeutic approaches to common inpatient disorders;
- More effectively respond to patients' questions in hospital medicine using the latest clinical literature;
- Integrate the latest technology tools in clinical practice.

ACCREDITATION

In support of improving patient care, the University of California, San Francisco is jointly accredited by the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME), the Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education (ACPE), and the American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC), to provide continuing education for the healthcare team.

UCSF designates this live activity for a maximum of **17.75 AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™**. Physicians should claim only the credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.

This CME activity meets the requirements under California Assembly Bill 1195, continuing education and cultural and linguistic competency.

Geriatric Medicine: The approved credits shown above include **6.5 Geriatric Credits** toward meeting the requirement under California Assembly Bill 1820, Geriatric Medicine.

Pain Management and End-of-Life Care: Approved credits include **5.25** toward meeting the requirement under California Assembly Bill 487, Pain Management and End-of-Life Care.

ABIM Maintenance of Certification Points: Successful completion of this CME activity, which includes participation in the evaluation component, enables the participant to earn up to **17.75 MOC** points in the American Board of Internal Medicine's (ABIM) Maintenance of Certification (MOC) program. Participants will earn MOC points equivalent to the amount of CME credits claimed for the activity. It is the CME activity provider's responsibility to submit participant completion information to ACCME for the purpose of granting ABIM MOC credit.

This CME/CE opportunity meets the **Medication Access and Training Expansion (MATE) Act** requirements from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) for Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) training on substance use disorders. Providers planning to receive or renew their DEA registration can earn **3.00** hours towards their one-time eight-hour MATE requirement by completing the entire activity.

Nurses: For the purpose of recertification, the American Nurses Credentialing Center accepts **AMA PRA Category 1 Credit™** issued by organizations accredited by the ACCME.

Pharmacotherapeutics CEUs for Nurses: For the purposes of recertification the American Nurses Credentialing Center accepts **AMA PRA Category 1 Credits™** issued by organizations accredited by the ACCME. This activity is designated for a maximum of **5.25** Pharmacotherapeutic Credits towards meeting the requirement for nursing pharmacology continuing education. Nurses should claim 0.1 CEUs per contact hour.

Pharmacists: The California Board of Pharmacy accepts as continuing professional education those courses that meet the standard of relevance to pharmacy practice and have been approved for **AMA PRA Category 1 Credit™**.

Physician Assistants: AAPA accepts Category 1 credit from AOACCME, prescribed credit from AAFP, and **AMA PRA Category 1 Credit™** from organizations accredited by the ACCME.
